Alabama	Immediately before an adult sex offender temporarily leaves county of residence for a period of three or more consecutive days. Code of Ala. § 15-20A-15(e)(2).
Alaska	By the next working day of becoming physically present in the state. AS 12.63.010.
Arizona	Within ten days after entering and remaining in any county of Arizona. A.R.S. § 13-3821

California	N/A on visiting. Information on transient persons Cal. Pen. Code § 290.013.

Connecticut	If person travels in CT on a recurring basis for periods of less than five days shall notify the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection. Conn. Gen. Stat. § 54-253
Delaware	N/A
Florida	Within 48 hours. Fla. Stat. § 943.0435.
Georgia	Must register if in state for 14 consecutive days or 30 days during any calendar year. O.C.G.A. § 42-1-12(e)(7).
Hawaii	Register if person remains in Hawaii for more than ten days or for an aggregate period exceeding thirty days in one calendar year. HRS § 846E-2(a).

Illinois	Register if remain in Illinois for three or more days. 730 ILCS 150/3.

Iowa	Within five business days. I.C.A. § 692A.104.

Michigan	Must immediately register if temporarily residing in the state. MCL § 28.724(6). "Immediately" means within 3 business days. MCL § 28.722(g) Definitions.
Minnesota	Remains in state for 14 days or longer or for an aggregate period of time exceeding 30 days during any calendar year. Minn. Stat. § 243.166(1b)(b).
Mississippi	N/A
Missouri	Any registered offender from another state who has a temporary residence in this state and resides more than seven days in a twelve-month period shall register for the duration of such person's temporary residency. § 589.400(11) R.S.Mo.
Montana	Transients must register within three business days. 46-23-504(1)(d), MCA.
Nebraska	N/A
Nevada	If the person is present for 48 hours or more within a city that has a city police department, the person shall be deemed an offender and shall register no later than 48 hours after arriving. Nev. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 179D.460(3).

New Mexico	You will need to register if you were convicted prior to July 1, 2013 and are going to be in the state of New Mexico for longer than ten (10) days. You will need to register within five (5) days if you were convicted after July 1, 2013.
New York	N/A
North Carolina	Register if: maintains a temporary residence in that county for more than 10 business days within a 30-day period, or for an aggregate period exceeding 30 days in a calendar year. N.C. Gen. Stat. Section 14-208.8A(a)(2).
North Dakota	Register within three days of coming into a county. N.D. Cent. Code, § 12.1-32-15(2).
Ohio	Register if the offender resides or has a temporary domicile in this state and has been employed in that county for more than three days or for an aggregate period of fourteen or more days in that calendar year. ORC Ann. 2950.04(2)(c).
Oklahoma	If intend to stay for five (5) consecutive days or longer, must register with the Department of Corrections within two (2) days after entering the state; and if intend to stay for two (2) consecutive days or longer, must register with the local law enforcement authority within two (2) days. 57 Okl. St. § 583(H).

South Carolina	Within three business days if resides in the state for a period of ten or more consecutive days. S.C. Code Ann. § 23-3-460(D).
South Dakota	To temporarily reside, within 3 business days § 22-24B-2

Tennessee	Within 48 hours of establishing a physical presence in the state. Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-39-203(c).
Texas	Even if do not intend to stay, but intend to reside for more than seven days, must register. Tex. Code Crim. Proc. Art. 62.051(a).
Utah	Within ten days of entering the state, regardless of length of stay. Utah Code Ann. § 77-41-105(1)(b).
Vermont	N/A
Virginia	3 days if present for “extended visit” (30 days). - Va. Code Ann. § 9.1-905(D)
Washington	3 business days if (1) planning to remain for 10 or more days or (2) lacking a fixed residence and planning to remain in new county for 24 hours. - Rev. Code Wash. (ARCW) § 9A.44.130(4)(a)(iv) & (vi)

Wisconsin	N/A
Wyoming	Must register only if offender enters state for purpose of residing, attending school, or being employed in the state. W.S. § 7-19-302(a). Residence includes any physical address the offender habitually visits or temporary residences such as hotels, parks, highways, etc. the offender may frequent for and use for shelter or other activities of daily living. W.S. § 7-19-301(a)(xi).

Guam	No later than three (3) working days after arrival on Guam. 9 GCA Section 89.03(d)(2)(D).
US Virgin Islands	N/A
